She received her Ph.D. from the Combined Program in East Asian Languages and Literatures and Film and Media Studies at Yale University in 2023. Her dissertation, "Sex on Screen in Japanese Cinema 1950s-1990s," argues for the significance of sexuality as a defining limit on what film can and cannot show, driving audience attention and social changes around sex and gender in postwar Japan.
